

The documentary film tells the saga of the Philadelphia couple who brought 50 Jewish children from Vienna to Philadelphia in 1939 before the start of World War II. This was the largest kindertransport to the United States.

Steven Pressmen, the filmmaker and author of the book of the same name, will speak at the screening. Paul Beller, at the time one of the young children on the transport, will also tell his story.

FROM THE CANTOR



Yes, Purim is here once again, and that must mean that Passover is not far behind! Now it's not my intention with this reminder to arouse the usual anxieties connected to the pre-Pesachprep. It's too early to start worrying -- we can put that

off for at least a week or so! For now, it's proper to simply bask in the glow of the rabbinic dictum, *mishenichnas Adar marbim b'simcha*—when the month of Adar arrives, we increase the joy in our lives. And of course the Purim celebration, with Megillat Esther, costumes, good food and moderate drink, should be at the center of that joy.

But the truth is I can't think about Purim without contemplating Pesach as well, and the reason is that there is always this feeling of annoyance, that I never, ever get to fully enjoy the goodies of *shalach manot*, especially the hamantaschen, before the time arrives that the *chametz* has got to go. If I had been consulted on the arrangement of the Jewish calendar, you can be sure that the holiday schedule would have looked quite a bit different!

On another level, there is a connection between the two holidays that relates to their popularity. Passover, specifically the Seder, is the most observed of Jewish rituals. We love getting together with family and friends over a great meal, with traditional culinary delicacies, and with the reciting in the Haggadah the story of our people. But when I speak to our schoolchildren, it seems they get most excited about Purim, because which child does not love to get dressed up in costumes? Interestingly, the tradition would prefer that the adults experience more of the joy of Purim, and that the children would relish and learn more the lessons of Pesach!

On yet a deeper level, there is another connection, or rather a distinction, between the two holidays. They both tell of miracles, but whereas the

wonders of the Exodus were fully manifest for all to see – the ten plagues, the splitting of the sea -- those of Purim were, as our Sages point out, *nistar*, *or* hidden. It is not apparent from the Megillah that the hand of G-d was involved. In fact, there is not even any mention of G-d.

Yet we celebrate Purim as a manifestation of Divine intervention in the lives of our ancestors in Persia, but through the agency of human beings, specifically, Mordechai and Esther. And so the holiday is a reminder that the great challenge for us all is to be able to see the wonders that are in the ordinary, to appreciate the miracles of everyday life. The simple act of eating and enjoying hamantaschen is in so many ways a miraculous wonder, and we should strive to be mindful of that, even if we may at times grumble about there not being enough time to enjoy them in the few weeks before the Festival of Freedom.


Paint & Pour at TBOBT Sunday March 22nd at 1pm



TBO-BT Men's Club **SHOMREI HA'ARETZ** STEWARDS OF THE LAND PROTECT VS USE

As part of the children's Tu B'Shavat seder and Men's Club project, Mike Miller lead a discussion on the importance of recycling paper (saving millions of trees), how new paper is made, and the importance of buying products made with a large amount of recycled paper content. The children volunteered a few examples; paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, plates, office paper. They then took shredded paper, soaked the paper in warm water, made pulp in a blender, spread the pulp on a screen, put the screen between towels, squeezed out the water with rolling pin, let the paper dry. At a following class they will use the drawing paper. Pictures are in this bulletin.

Thank you to Paul Hymanson, Bob Kolker, Russ Kelner and Cantor Stern who helped prepare the materials. A special thank you to Cantor Stern for directing the paper making production line. Thank you to the teachers and parents for organizing the students and setting up the seder.


