## FROM THE CANTOR



*The following is a brief adaptation of Cantor Stern's Rosh Hashanah sermon.*

There is the story of the man who was complaining that his wife was having problems with her hearing. So a friend said to him, "If you want to know exactly how bad the problem is, stand behind her at a distance and say something out loud, and see if she responds. If not, then keep moving closer and closer until you get to the point where she finally hears you. Then you will know the extent of the problem."

He agrees and goes and stands behind her and says, "Dear, what's for dinner?" There is no response. He comes closer. "What's for dinner?" She is silent. He repeats this several more times until he is standing right over her shoulder and again loudly asks, "What's for dinner?" She finally responds, "For the fifth time... spaghetti and meatballs!"

With humor, this story reminds us that we do not always recognize the real source of our problems. But it is also, at its most basic level, simply about sounds and the sense of hearing.

Of all the senses, our tradition seems to prefer hearing. Shema Yisrael...Hear O Israel! And what is it that we are supposed to hear? That Adonai is our G-d, Adonai is One. But it is not just about the monotheistic concept of one G-d. It is fundamentally about ethical monotheism, recognizing that there is much that is not right with this world, and we are charged by our Creator with the obligation to fix it. That is why we are a people that is so restless, that resists complacency. Shimon Peres, the President of Israel, has stated that "the Jewish people's greatest contribution to history is dissatisfaction. We're a nation born to be discontented!"

Peres is not just saying that we kvetch too much, (although sometimes we're guilty of that too). Rather, he is saying that in a world filled with

injustice and unfilled legitimate needs, there is no place for complacency and contentment. *L'taken olam b'malchut Shaddai* – we are to fix the world under the kingdom of G-d. We have always been at the forefront of the impulse to make this world a better place. It began with Abraham, the very first Jew, who when confronted with G-d's intention to destroy the city of Sodom, cried out, "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do justly?" And it is the Torah that reminds us over and over again that it is our task to help the poor and less fortunate, to do justice even for the strangers in our midst.

We are a people that heard the voice at Sinai, and it resonates throughout every generation. And so we are discontented, dissatisfied, not afraid to argue, to disagree, to object. It is in our genes. The sounds of argument and disagreement may be unwelcome to others, but for us Jews it is the sound of music....

As we take leave of the High Holidays of 5774, the challenge we have is to listen to our inner voices of discontent. What is it that troubles us – about ourselves, about our community, about our world? And what is it that we plan to do about it in this coming year?

May the sounds we have heard during these holidays -- the sounds of prayer, of music, of the shofar -- usher in a year of dreams fulfilled, for us, for our loved ones, and for all of Israel.

# FROM THE PRESIDENT

The New Year greets us with a combination of joy and sadness. It is a holy time unmatched at any point in the Jewish calendar.

There is joy because we are here to celebrate together with family and special friends. We have the precious opportunity to begin again and do things better this

time. Hope is abundant. There is sadness because we know at this season of the year, even if we at other times forget or deny it, life is serious and at times difficult.

The world remains in need of repair and parts are broken. It is true too many of our resolutions from New Years past remain unfulfilled, but we can turn to them this year. The shofar's blast assures us that turning and returning are possible. As I sit in shul each Rosh Hashanah, the shofar seems to be calling out to me with one question: Am I using my time correctly? It is of great importance to the vitality and direction of our shul that we not have too many members of a secret service. We need to embrace a broad range of topics and projects this coming year. We must be disciplined to achieve these goals. We need to reach out to our families, our friends, our community and our synagogue. My goal this year is to help one another and to lead our congregation with commitment, honesty and hopefully wisdom, so that we will grow to be a strong Temple Beth Or/Beth Torah. This is your shul -- please come when you can and support our services and programs.

We are a vibrant, exciting community with a broad variety of interests, talents, wants, and desires. Look around this room -- we are a diverse group and yet, we are one!! 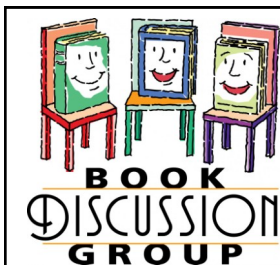

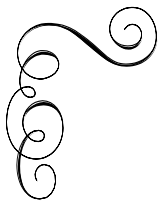

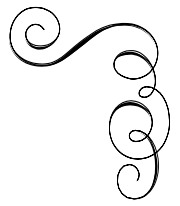
