We probably all agree the year goes by much too quickly. There's no remedy for that, except to fill our days with as much life, joy and meaning as we can.

Dear Cantor Stern,


I hope your Thanksgiving and Chanukah were wonderful!

Jerusalem is the world's most treasured and fought-over city. It is considered holy to three great religions representing more than half of the world's people. What is the source of the conflict, how long has it been going on, what are the various claims surrounding it and what are the chances of a peaceful resolution? These are the issues to be addressed by Dr. Mordechai Kedar, Assistant Professor of Arabic and Middle East Studies at Bar-Ilan University and a member of the Herzliya Inter-Disciplinary Center study team on "Facing Radical Islam". Dr. Kedar is a Lt. Colonel (Res) in the IDF. He is fluent in Hebrew, English and Arabic and a recognized expert on Islam and Arabic culture.
