## FROM THE CANTOR



There was a memorable moment from my recent trip to LA when I was waiting in line at the airport to get my boarding pass for the return trip home. A tall gentleman behind me, with an interesting accent, suddenly asked me if I was a professor. No, I responded, and asked why he thought so. He pointed to the good number of books

I was carrying in my shoulder bag (that I was bringing back from the Jewish educators conference). I told him that while I wasn't a professor, I did have occasion to do some teaching. "Oh, what do you teach?" he asked. I thought for a moment and then responded simply, "Judaica." Looking at me intently, and then almost with what seemed like a sudden sigh of great relief, he declared, "Baruch HaShem!"

Now, that was the last thing I expected to hear. It turned out he was from Argentina and was accompanying his daughter on her way to her first year of study as an undergraduate at an Ivy League university. And then, suddenly addressing me as rabbi, he asked if I would kindly give his daughter some sage advice as she was about to embark upon her college career. He was apparently pleased with what I had to say, because he very graciously thanked me and declared with great satisfaction that it was truly *bashert* that we had met at that particular moment in time.

LA has a large and active Jewish community, and while I had occasion to spend much of my time in the company of Jewish educators, scholars, rabbis and cantors, I surely did not expect this brief encounter at the airport. Yet, from the outset of the conversation, I had the feeling of being in the company of mishpocho; it was as if this gentleman and his daughter were members of my extended family.

The Jewish people are one family. I have been thinking more and more about this, especially as we -- our brothers and sisters in Israel, to be sure, but Jews everywhere, as well -- have had to navigate a difficult and unpleasant summer. I keep thinking about how we are all connected, how much we need each other. There are more and more places in this world that are proving to be less and less hospitable and safe. Our unity and our solidarity becomes ever more and more critical.

As with all families, we do bicker and disagree on so many issues, from politics, to religion, to basic matters of security. But a people small in number can never afford to forget the rabbinic injunction that *kol yisrael arevim zeh lazeh* -- we are all responsible one for another. We are responsible for our brothers and sisters in Israel, just as they are responsible for us, and we are responsible for Jews everywhere, as they are all responsible for us.

As the New Year 5775 approaches, let us we pray for peace and security, and let us pray that we will always stand together as one people, one family, and that with the help of G-d, we will successfully face the challenges that lie ahead.



### TBO-BT Men's Club SHOMREI HA'ARETZ/ STEWARDS OF THE LAND Shmittah: Humans in Balance with Earth

The next Shmittah year will begin on Rosh Hashanah 5775, (September 24, 2014).

"And six years you will sow your land, and gather in the land's produce; but the seventh year you will release it from work and abandon it, that the poor of your people may eat; and what they leave, the beast of the field shall eat. In like manner you will deal with your vineyard, and with your olive orchard." *(Exodus 23:10-11)* 

Shmittah, literally translated as the 'year of release,' and more widely known as the Sabbatical Year, is a biblical Jewish tradition which, once every seven years,

simultaneously re-adjusted agriculture and commerce to ensure an equitable, just and healthy society. The year of Shmittah was a time when agricultural lands were collectively left fallow. The Earth is not merely some resource to be used and abused. If we want to live on the land, it is our responsibility to let it rest.

What should *shmittah* look like today? What would it mean to let the land rest every seventh year? What would it mean to family, synagogue and local Jewish community if we were to recognize the power of *shmittah* through a plethora of creative, dynamic and locally-based methods?


The Men's Club hopes the congregation will participate by visiting with the special adults during the Kiddish luncheon and Oneg.




