Beginning at sunset on Tuesday, May 30th and ending at nightfall on Thursday, June 1st, Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks, commemorates the giving of the Law to Moses and the Jewish people at Mt. Sinai. It is customary during Shavuot to read from the *Book of Ruth* and say Yizkor. Please join us at services during this uplifting and spiritual holiday.

<u>Cantor's Discretionary Fund</u> – is a vehicle by which the Cantor assists individuals and organizations that come to his personal attention in need of additional funds for emergencies, on-going activities or special projects in the US, Israel or anywhere in the world.
