From the Cantor



The following is a brief excerpt from Cantor Stern's Yom Kippur sermon.

Not long ago I was sitting in my office with a family that was checking out our shul. We talked about

programming, holidays, education for children. I felt I had pretty good answers for all their specific questions, but as I spoke with them I suddenly realized what I had always known but never so viscerally felt -- namely, that it was not merely the substance of the answers that mattered, but rather whether the parents would find in our school, in our teachers, in our clergy, the role models they sought for their children and perhaps for themselves as well. We were being judged not only by what we said and what we taught but by who we were. Were we perceived as kind and caring, tolerant yet strong, confident and having conviction?

We know that especially children need positive role models. Of course the primary ones are parents. Kids watch everything we do, everything we say, and it all impacts who they become.

But there are other role models as well – teachers, coaches, entertainers, sports figures and politicians. Did I say politicians? Yes I did, and please know that I will not for one moment get into any discussion of politics or which candidate I may or may not support. The only thing I will say is I wish the candidates talked less, **all of them.**

My hero in this regard is Calvin Coolidge. He was our 30th president. He had what one would call a laconic style, that is to say, he was very sparing with his words. One time at a dinner at the White House he was seated next to a woman who said to him, "Mr. President, I've made a bet that I can get you to say three words." He looked at her and said, "You lose!" Another time he came home from Sunday church and his wife who was waiting for him at home asked, "So what did the minister speak about?" "Sin," he said. "Oh, what did he say about it?" "He said he was against it!"

Now that may be taking terseness to an extreme, but more measured language on the part **everyone** is a good thing!

It's not just children who need good role models. We adults do as well. We need people we can look up to, who inspire us to grow, to be the best that we can be. We need role models for us as individuals and we need role models who can represent us as a people, men and women who we feel can speak for us. This year was a particularly difficult one in that the Jewish world lost a number of very special men and women who served as role models....

We can only be ourselves, but we must be the best version of ourselves. We must be role models. I sat this past week with a family in our community that had experienced a loss. And as I spoke with the good man's daughters they said to me that their dad was a really great father and that he was a great role model. And I said, there is not anything that you can say that is more meaningful. He was a role model who taught you how to love your Jewish tradition, he taught you to respect your fellow man. That is the highest tribute you can pay to anyone. Those are the things they hopefully will one day say of us. Whether we are parents, or grandparents, whether we are ushers in a congregation or just regular congregants, we can all be role models. Our tradition needs us to be that, and indeed the entire world needs for us to be that. It cries out for each and every one of us to be examples for others.

In this New Year, may we be blessed with good health, with peace and with equanimity, and may we use those blessings to become the best role models we can be for those with whom we share this ultimate blessing called life.





LIST OF TBOBT FUNDS FOR DONATIONS

<u>Cantor's Discretionary Fund</u> – is a vehicle by which the Cantor assists individuals and organizations that come to his personal attention in need of additional funds for emergencies, on-going activities or special projects in the US, Israel or anywhere in the world.

Jewish National Fund Trees – certificates can be purchased for all occasions in denominations of \$18. Please contact the temple office, 732-381-8403.


