

<u>Cantor's Discretionary Fund</u> – is a vehicle by which the Cantor assists individuals and organizations that come to his personal attention in need of additional funds for emergencies, on-going activities or special projects in the US, Israel or anywhere in the world.

<u>Jewish National Fund Trees</u> – certificates can be purchased for all occasions in denominations of \$18. Please contact the temple office, 732-381-8403.
