## **From the Cantor**



Here is an excerpt from my Rosh Hashanah sermon that I thought might be worth reading in the current postelection climate.

So how do we get ourselves out of the mud of division, of

constant recrimination. To start, let us emulate the Rebbe of Berditchev -- to be able to be *dan kol odom l'kaf zechut*, to give each other the benefit of the doubt, to listen to one another, to see the positive rather than always the negative, to be able to argue our positions with passion, but always with respect.

There is a midrash that says that on Rosh Hashanah G-d begins the day sitting on his throne of din, his throne of judgement, and upon hearing all of our prayers, He switches to His throne of rachamim, of mercy. It is a comforting thought, but it also tells us that G-d is both a G-d of din and rachamim, of mishpat and chesed, of law and of kindness. He is both, and we too must embody both virtues individually and as a society.

I think that much of what separates us is that we see the world through differing lenses. Some through chesed and some through mishpat. Chesed is about actions and an attitude of lovingkindness and compassion. It's where we care for those less fortunate, act to help those in need. It is the lens of the prophets, who argued above all for social justice

Mishpat is about the need for responsibility, for administering law and holding people accountable for their transgressions. Whether by nature or nurture, we tend to choose one of those approaches and we view the other side with contempt.

The fundamental truth is that both chesed and mishpat are necessary -- a society without chesed is a society not worth living in, and a society in which there is no mishpat, is a society in which it will soon become impossible to live. Too many of us are not able to balance the two, and we do not know how to bring each other to a middle ground of compromise.

A great deal is at stake. Some very thoughtful folks are saying that we are headed toward a precipice. A very recent op-ed in a prestigious newspaper discussed what could happen if the upcoming elections are perceived by either side to be not decided fairly. The results will be hotly contested and perhaps even violence could ensue.

It's a sign of our times that I hear repeated often the words of Benjamin Franklin. He was leaving the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787, and he was approached by a Mrs. Elizabeth Powel, a prominent society figure who said to him, "Dr. Franklin, what have we got, a republic or a monarchy?" And he replied, "A republic, if you can keep it!" Franklin understood the work and the mindset we would need to form and sustain a democratic republic. Let us pray that we can keep it.

I am anxious about the state of our nation, but I am also hopeful, because I believe that at some point, instead of politicians we will start to elect statesmen. I believe that at some point a consensus will emerge that we need both chesed and mishpat, and that together we can find the middle ground. And I believe that challenges such as this terrible pandemic will leave us in many ways wiser, more humble and more resilient. *Kein yehi ratzon*, may it be G-d's will....

#### **From The President**

#### The following is from President Audrey Silverman's Rosh Hashana address:

L'Shana Tovah!

We are all here to pray together and to celebrate the New Year. TBOBT is blessed to have Cantor Steven Stern as our spiritual leader and to welcome back Rabbi Lubow on his 9<sup>th</sup> year joining Cantor in leading our community through these challenging times.

COVID-19 pressed pause on life as we know it, and we simply don't know what will come next. In 2020 our lives have been put on hold, and maybe have been altered in ways we don't fully understand. As everyone struggled through the pandemic, unfamiliar terms and technology surrounded us. Phrases such as social distancing, community spread, flattening the curve, co-morbidity and telemedicine became words in the mouths of millions of people. Suddenly this lexicon truly meant we are all in this pandemic together. We must stay positive through spiritual and social connections. This year TBOBT came together virtually to learn, to sing, to pray and to connect over 60 times thanks to Cantor Stern. Our morning minyan began mid May. Michael Vogel, now in Sedona, Arizona davens every Sunday assisted by Howard Silverman and Michael Goldstein. We appreciate all those who attend to keep our Sunday morning minyan going.

The seriousness of COVID-19 is no laughing matter, but we all needed to find a way to cope with the dangers and limitations. In the past six months we completed a virtual full-body meditation, attended a wellness symposium featuring Cantor Stern, Dr. Esther Schlesinger, and Ann Oliff, a nurse and massage therapist. In the spring we also enjoyed the comedy of Bob Alper, a rabbi and comedian, and thanks to Evie Shulman, our Ways and Means Vice President, we had two successful fundraisers, a Trivia Nite and a Laugh Out Loud Comedy Show featuring 5 comedians. We thank all our sponsors who contributed to both events and all those who participated. At the beginning of the summer, we watched a video of a concert featuring legendary Cantor Moshe Koussevitsky and our infamous Cantor Stern singing in the choir at age 10. It was glorious and enjoyable.

Thank you to our TBOBT family who reached and performed acts of kindness by phoning a friend and delivering supplies to needy families.

A synagogue is where we mark the most joyful and the most painful moments in our lives. This year our paths were paved with challenges and opportunities. Our TBOBT family attended virtual funerals, shivas, and memorials for our dear departed members. We attended virtually and a few carefully in-person weddings, bridal showers, and bat mitvahs.

Our Board members and trustees encourage me with their wisdom and support us with their time and resources. Due to these unprecedented times your Board met virtually and made a commitment to extend their terms for six extra months, which ends in December. Yasher Koach to the Board and Trustees. Soon our nominating committee, Janice Hymanson and Lillian Makow, will be calling you for volunteers to complete our slate of officers for 5781. Please answer the call and consider being part of TBOBT's future.

The High Holidays serve as a powerful reminder not to take your time for granted. It doesn't help to focus on making things feel as they did before, so much has changed. This is a time for reflection and renewal, and to realize we are strong. Some days we would wake up and not know what day it was, we would realize by checking our weekly pill cases. However, we are strong, we are here. Strength isn't about how much you can handle before you break, it is about how much you can endure after you have felt broken.

Yasher Koach to Fern Cammy, our Ritual Vice President, and to our Ritual High Holiday Task Force. A team of 12 endured three months of virtual meetings dealing with the complexities of how to re-open and conduct our services safely and meaningfully.

Yasher Koach to our Sisterhood and President Joleen Fridson. Her team of ladies assembled our High Holiday gift bags with many useful goodies; our congregation admires and respects all that Sisterhood accomplishes throughout the year. Thank you to our Men's Club led by President Michael Goldstein; here are a group of hard working men, who came together at a moment's notice. On August 4th, our small sanctuary was damaged when a tree slammed through our roof. These men came to the synagogue that afternoon and made sure all twelve Torahs were removed and would not be destroyed by water or mold. Their dedication and camaraderie is our blessing. A special thank you to Michael Roth; after the tropical storm, and before the professional mitigation started, Michael removed barrels of water from the sanctuary. He also works tirelessly around the outside of our synagogue beautifying our landscape. Our youngest members also helped our Men's Club— Jonathan and Elizabeth Eckert set up the Machzors for our ticket pick-up.

Yasher Koach to our Security Task Force committee, led by our Project Manager Marty Richstein. We are in our second year, and hope to begin construction, which will improve our security initiatives. Please know we also received a Security Personnel Grant in the amount of \$10,000, and have started receiving reimbursements. Thanks to Jonathan Philips, our Executive Vice President, who corresponds with and submits all the proper documentation to the NJ Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness.

For the New Year, peace is choosing to find happiness in unpleasant circumstances. Peace is a daily choice to be patient and calm. It is, as our granddaughter so eloquently said, like planting a flower and watching it grow. I am inspired by the dedication, choices and innovation each of you has shown during my extended presidency. Thank you to Judy Hurok, whose commitment in overseeing the workings of our office makes our synagogue runs smoothly and efficiently. Thanks to Bonni Clark, our office administrator, who works tirelessly to keep everything functioning well on a daily basis. Thank you Rayna Warner and Lillian Makow, for helping with all our mailings whenever Bonni calls. Your dedication is admirable. We can finally say welcome back Mariela, it is good to see you again.

Success is determined in great part by our ability to keep trying. Cantor Stern and Rabbi Lubow have put their heart and soul in making sure our High Holiday services are meaningful and inspirational for all to see and hear.




